

CT scan of the orbit

Why the scan is being done

With the help of the scan, diseases and the structure in the orbit area can be detected.

Getting ready for the scan

Remove jewellery and piercings from the head area before the scan.

If you have not received other instructions from the unit where you are treated, you may take your regular medications as normal.

If you have a sensor that measures glucose in interstitial fluid, replace the sensor after the scan.

Inform the radiographer before the scan if you are hypersensitive to contrast medium that contains iodine.

Before the scan, tell the radiographer if you are pregnant or suspect pregnancy.

How the scan is done

The CT scanner is used to obtain cross-sectional images of the orbit area using X-rays.

The scan is painless.

During the scan, it is important to lie absolutely still. You will lie on your back on the examination table.

The table will move during the scan.

The radiographer will be able to see you, hear you, and talk to you at all times during the scan.

You may be given a contrast medium that contains iodine into a vein to improve visibility of your blood vessels and tissues.

The contrast medium will cause a temporary sensation of warmth and you may have a metallic taste in your mouth.

The contrast medium will be eliminated from your body through urine.

The scan takes about 15 minutes.

However, you should reserve slightly more time for your appointment.

After the scan

Drink plenty of fluids after the scan.

Drinking helps to eliminate the contrast medium from your body.

Where do you get the scan results

You will get the results from the referring outpatient clinic or ward.

Other considerations

There is no separate fee for the scan; it is included in the outpatient clinic fee.

If you are unable to attend your scheduled appointment, please let us know as soon as possible.

A penalty fee will be charged for a missed appointment not cancelled in advance.
